In section 2 of the Act in the interpretation of MSSA 'pistol grip' (referred to in (a)(vi) of the definition) means a free-standing pistol grip

Free-standing pistol grip means -

- (a) the bottom of the grip of the firearm_is not supported by or is not part of any one piece or integral structure (excluding the trigger guard)connecting the grip to the stock; and
- (b) does not include a thumbhole, or Dragunov style stock.
